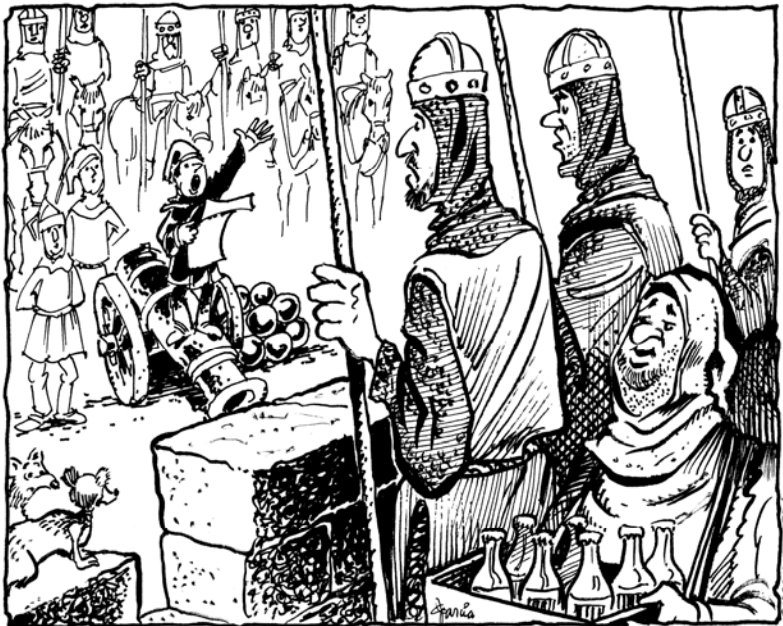


## FINAL WORDS

## December Speaker Sings For Her Breakfast

Jennifer Naimo-Morales, actress, singer, and Broadway performer was our very entertaining speaker for the December breakfast. The fourth of five children of a loud Italian Catholic Family, Jennifer grew up in Grand Rapids, Michigan. Her interest in music began at an early age when she first kept rhythm by bumping her head on her crib – and later transferred the practice to a rocking chair! The first song she sang was “Immaculate Mary”.

Jennifer attended a Catholic grade school where she did imitations of Karen Carpenter, Helen Reddy, and Barbara Streisand (her favorite). Singing was her way of winning friends. She said that at one point her parents attended a Charismatic prayer meeting, and chose to follow the Lord instead of money. From then on every choice was centered on prayer. She attended Catholic high school and was a cross country and long distance runner. It was during this time that she was inspired by her coach who was a paraplegic, and taught her the term “gut-bust”, which means there is always something more in you.

After high school, she attended New York University where she was the only undergraduate in their three-year conservatory program. New York City was a culture shock in many ways and no one thought she would survive. Jennifer did though, and learned that the choices a person makes now will affect the rest of eternity. She stayed firm, and everyone knew she was Catholic.

Jennifer’s first job was in Williamstown, Massachusetts, followed by a four-month job in Israel, and then she eventually ended up on Broadway. Most recently she played in the hit musical “Jersey Boys”. Throughout her career she feels the Lord has been her biggest agent. He always gives her quality jobs and puts Catholics or Christians near her. She carries a statue of her favorite saint, St. Therese, everywhere she goes, and always finds a church wherever she is. Her career has also presented her with many interesting challenges to deal with such as womanizing men, avoiding questionable language in her scripts, and reaching out to fallen Catholics.

Recently she has made videos for little children on the Rosary and the Eucharist, and also has done sing-alongs and prayers. Jennifer ended by singing a beautiful version of “What Child Is This”.

## Book Review

Ever Ancient Ever New

If you haven't met Fr. Corapi, I recommend it! Fr. Corapi is found on EWTN and KNXT, Catholic Radio and at various conferences throughout the country. As apologetic speakers go, his style is earthy and orthodox, much like listening to a favorite uncle recounting a wonderful adventure. His presentation is very much a part of what makes his talks so cool, but that also presents a problem if, like I, you drive a 1994 mint green ex-forestry dept. 4x4 Chevy with no CD or tape player.

While Fr. Corapi is well published in audio formats, I could only find one book authored by him, Ever Ancient Ever New a collection of twenty two articles. It is a little book, quite hard to find but it is a trophy well worth the hunt. Each article covers a contemporary issue on diverse subjects---everything from Divine Revelation to the role of Laity in the Church, Mary the Mother of the New Evangelization to the Last Judgment and Purgatory, Angels and Demons to Matrimony and the passing of Pope John Paul the Great. Such a broad range of subjects are covered that afterwards I got the feeling that I had read a super abridged edition of the Catechism. In 126 pages, no less!

Hey, if you're short on time for reading about your faith, this is probably the biggest bang for the buck you'll come across. Like I said it is a difficult book to find. If you are fortunate enough to find a copy (and The Holy Child Bookstore on the Northwest corner of Bullard and Palm, in Fresno, might be able to track a copy down for you) and you can bear to part with it after you've read it, you might consider donating it to your parish library. Or better yet buy two copies and keep one in the truck.
