Speaker Recap - Katherine Andes

Our November speaker, Tom Carroll, did not disappoint the crowd. Carroll, who hails from Visalia, is a former officer with the Clandestine Service of the CIA. He spent years under cover in the Middle East. While living in Istanbul, Turkey, he and his wife converted to Catholicism within six months of moving there.

He told our group, "I was raised a Baptist, but if you go to Turkey and see all the ancient churches that date back to early Christianity, it affects you. You can make an argument that the Catholic Church is wrong about this or that doctrine, but you can't make the argument that all of the ancient churches were wrong."

Carroll presented a historical and realistic assessment of the situation in the Middle East. He doesn't put on rose-colored glasses, but he also doesn't overlook the good things. He pointed out some interesting facts like, in the 1980s, Bethlehem was 50% Christian, today it's 5%. Another interesting fact is that Syria is 39% Christian and that Bashir Al Asad protects them. If he falls, the Christians will likely be persecuted as were, and still are, after Sadam Hussein's fall.

Carroll believes that some hope may lie in the current development of Turkey, where a "neo-Ottoman" consensus appears to be emerging. The results are a secular state that is pro free-enterprise, with a broader view of the Middle East. Some Muslims, whose families had historically been Christian, are converting back to Christianity and they are not being persecuted. Former church properties are being given back, Christian churches are being restored, and more openly Christian politicians are running for and being elected to office. None of the preceding are perfect or of pure intent, but they are there nonetheless and Carroll sees them as openings for a better Middle East.

During the question and answer period, Carroll recommended a book entitled How Civilizations Die: (And Why Islam is Dying Too) by David P. Goldman. Carroll said it was a "brilliant" book. It tells how some important Muslim countries have an extremely low birthrate and the ramifications for the future.

Also during the Q&A, a question was asked about his view of Benghazi. He said that he doesn't know what happened, but he found it illuminating that up to 30,000 Libyan protestors in Benghazi marched against the militias that had murdered the Americans, turning them over to authorities, and causing them to flee. That is a large proportion of the population of Benghazi that was involved in the protests.

Carroll also brought some ancient artifacts for us to touch and examine after the meeting. A Canaanite oil lamp from 800 B.C.; a more advanced Greek oil lamp from 300 B.C.; and, an Armenian bridal wash basin from the early 1900s. He did ask us to "be careful" when handling them. We were.


The Battle Ground, Syria and Palestine, the Seed Plot of Religion By Hilaire Belloc 291 pages, paper bound. Ignatius Press, San Francisco

The Battle Ground was written in 1938 at a time when there were very many battle grounds around the globe which Belloc could have written about so at first glance it seems rather odd that he'd select Syria as a topic then, but in view of what's happening in the middle east now it offers a splendid narrative---in a style not unlike James Michener (or maybe Michener's style should be considered not unlike Belloc's?) Of what was and what still is going on in Syria and why religion plays such a large part in it.

The book devotes quite a bit of the first part to the harsh physical geography of Syria and is recollected throughout the rest of the book---it is an excellent description and important in understanding why and how the economic, political and religious potential of the region developed the way it did.

Belloc explains how Egypt, Assyria, Persia, Greece, Israel and Rome in turn "tilled" the soil in the desert, so to speak, and how the seeds of Christianity were sown leading to a victory until the sand dunes of the desert representative of Islam once more despoiled the land.

This is an insightful book, especially now that the US

Bill Lucido Deacon was born in Quantico, VA, and grew up in San Diego. He attended Sacred Heart Academy

in Ocean Beach and graduated from University of San Diego High School. After two years at the University of San Diego, he transferred to Fresno State College and obtained a Bachelor's degree in Mathematics in 1970. He earned his pilot's wing from the United State Air Force and spent 30 years in the California Air National Guard.
