March Speaker - Ms. Mona Faulkner

Our Friday, April 10th speaker will be our new Superintendent for the Roman Catholic Diocese of Fresno schools, Ms. Mona Faulkner.

After five years as Superintendent of thirteen schools for the Diocese of Burlington, Vermont, serving nearly 2.300 students, Mona comes to Fresno, where our twenty-

one diocesan schools serve over 5,500 students.

Mona earned her B.A. in Elementary Education from College of St. Benedict and her M.A. in Human Development from St. Mary's University. Mona has two masters degrees, one in human development and the other in parent education; she also earned a postgraduate degree in educational administrative leadership, and she is a certified leadership coach.

Mona has an extensive background in Catholic school administration with more than 40 years within the school system, thirty-two of which were at Catholic schools. Previously, she has served as president of the St. Elizabeth Seton School, part of the archdiocese of St. Paul/Minneapolis as well as Principal at two other Minnesota schools, St. John the Evangelist School and St. Stephens School.

In the Diocese of Fresno, the primary mission of Catholic School Education is to be an effective instrument of the Catholic Church in its ministry of teaching the Gospel message and assisting children to grow into fullness of life in Jesus. This mission supports parents in their role as the primary educators of their children.

Speaker Recap By Pauline Smoke


Kara Klein is a magnificent paradox. She simultaneously radiates complete calm and barely contained energy. The 29-year-old singer/songwriter grew up in New Orleans in "a family with living

faith"— faith that was tested by the untimely deaths of her brother and father, another brother's drug addiction, her sister's unwed pregnancy, and the ravages of Hurricane Katrina.

From childhood on, Kara felt a "hunger to know God." However, she long believed that God's love depended on her actions. She describes having "faith, but not trust." In the wake of her personal tragedies, she sought out Comunità Cenacolo, a residential lay faith community dedicated to helping the desperate and disillusioned find peace and joy. Amidst its recovering addicts, she encountered Jesus in a personal way that led her to lasting faith, and discovered that "joy is hidden in sacrifice and service."

Kara has sung for as long as she can remember, and began writing faith-based songs at age eight or nine. Her CP&BC presentation began with a performance of "Simply Father," a musical supplication for an intimate father-daughter relationship with God. She closed with "Way-Maker," which expresses her belief that every problem can be resolved by trusting in God. The healing she has witnessed within her family — her brother's now drug-free life, her sister's marriage to her baby's father, and her mother's remarriage — reassures her that, "God will use everything for good."

While in Fresno, Kara recorded a television interview. Look for it on Channel 49 and YouTube in the coming months.






In Memory of Mr. Frank Anthony Borges, Co-Founder Fresno CP&BC October 17, 1926 - March 14, 2015
