

Church Councils: 100 Questions and Answers By Paul Senz Ignatius Press, San Francisco 2023 137 pages, paperbound

Here is a fantastic opportunity to discover that over the past 2,000 years, the Catholic Church can authoritatively say "been there, done that," when it comes to issues arising from recurring errors and popular half-baked interpretations of doctrine advanced by various theologians over the course of history.

Senz starts out by giving us a very well written and easily understood definition of various kinds of church councils and the 'hows' and 'whys' they were, and still can be, called into being.

This is an important book because it also outlines the issues solved, to a greater or lesser degree, by the first 22 Councils.

Students in real Catholic schools should be assigned to memorize and outline this book, so when called out over some false perceptions they could respond with "the Church fixed that definitively during the First Council of Nicaea in AD 325."

In fact, we could all stand to memorize an outline of this book and the best way to do that is get your own copy of "Church Councils" at Cotter's Religious Goods and write your own outline.

February Speaker Recap



Jonna Schuster

God works through His created beings. He has purposed us to be here, to grow, to learn, and to be apostles, stated breakfast speaker Jonna Schuster. He enables, wishes us to thrive and flourish, and gives permission to be imperfect.

He has provided resources to lean on which can break through limitations and time constraints. Through God's abundance, we can do great things with God, not just for God. As Saint Paul tells us in I Cor 2:16, "We are given the mind of Christ." Therefore, it is our duty to share solutions in the world and to serve others.

Jonna cited numerous scripture examples of how we have access to what we need – "every spiritual blessing in the heavens." She recalled how agricultural scientist/inventor George Washington Carver encouraged Southern farmers to grow peanuts, only to result in an excess of the crop. Carver credited God with giving him knowledge and insight to find solutions by creating over 300 peanut products.

She emphasized four keys to building relationships with God and the Holy Spirit:

- 1. Go to God in prayer, with expectancies.
- 2. Ask God questions.
- 3. Develop awareness of experiences; we can do things beyond perceived human capacity but try not to complicate.
- 4. Discern what you thought you heard.

Jonna and Jim Schuster came to California in 2018 and in 2019 cofounded Catholic Revival Ministries. They had worked together 10 years previously as Directors of Youth Ministry in the Diocese of Arlington, Virginia. Jonna is a University of Illinois graduate and holds a Master's degree in Moral Theology from Christendom Graduate School. She serves as an adjunct professor of theology at Saint Paul the Great Catholic University in Escondido. They reside in Santa Clarita, California.
