February 9th Jonna Schuster

Our February 9th breakfast speaker is Jonna Schuster, Co-Founder and Director of Catholic Revival Ministries (CRM) https://www.

catholicrevivalministries.com, which she launched in 2019 with her husband Jim. Together they serve the Church by equipping Catholics to bring supernatural impact to all areas of life by partnering with the Holy Spirit in power and love. They have served a variety of parishes, ministries, and audiences world-wide, including "Endow," "Metanoia Catholic," "Pray More Novenas," "TANOVA," "Awaken Kingdom," the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, the Diocese of Peoria, IL, and the Diocese of Austin, TX.

Jonna graduated from the University of Illinois with a degree in graphic design and completed a Master's degree in Moral Theology at Christendom Graduate School. She spent 10 years as a full-time Director of Youth Ministry in the diocese of Arlington, VA. Before that she served for two years as the first Campus Minister of Western Illinois University. She and Jim moved to California in 2018 and currently reside in Santa Clarita. In addition to her work at CRM, Jonna is also an adjunct professor of theology at John Paul the Great Catholic University in Escondido. She believes everyone is called to greatness and has a heart to see people come into the fullness of their identity and calling.

Jonna will be speaking about navigating important decisions and innovating new projects to problem-solving and caring for our loved ones, and how we do not have to rely on our human strength alone. As Catholics she explains that we have received "the mind of Christ" (1 Cor 2:16) and can turn to Him for insight and strategies regarding the issues we face today. In this presentation, Jonna will share stories and methods of how we can invite the Lord into our thought process, provide practical tools for discerning His guidance, and suggest ways of collaborating with Him in our everyday pursuits.

December Business Person of the Month – Monsignor Patrick McCormick



My name is Patrick Joseph McCormick, and I had a twin brother, Michael, who passed away of Covid in 2021. We both attended St. Mary's Catholic School in Taft, CA, where we were born. It was in the seventh grade that I because the organist for the children's choir and began to play for weddings on Saturdays. Then in the eighth grade I first had a sense of being called to the priesthood.

When I began Taft Union High School, I was in the music department along with all my other classes because I was interested in becoming a music teacher. I did not receive a call to priesthood during my high school years. I guess I was having too much fun and enjoying life.

After graduating from high school, I attended Taft College and then transferred to Fresno State University. It was in my junior and senior years that I started to think about priesthood a second time. In my senior year I went to speak with Father Sergio Negro about

my vocation. While still working on my teaching credential, he asked me to begin a process of praying about a vocation. He went on to say to me several times that going to the seminary does not mean that you will be a priest. But it is the place to find out if God wants you to be a priest. Well, the process of going to the seminary did just that, God was calling me to priesthood.

I attended St. John's Seminary in Camarillo, CA and in the fourth year of theology I was called in the bishop's office along with one classmate and told to sit down because Bishop Hugh Donohoe had a particularly important question to ask us. Did we want to go to Rome in June 1975 and be ordained by his Holiness Pope Paul VI? We both said that we needed to talk with our parents. My father had passed away in 1970 and my mother was a Baptist, and so I was to call my father's relatives to ask their opinion. They all said yes – go!

My priesthood has given me many opportunities during these past 48 years. I was first assigned to the Shrine of St. Therese where I spent three years. Then I was sent to the Catholic University of American in Washington, D.C. to study liturgy and music, and later became the director of the Office of Worship for the Diocese of Fresno and lived at St. Anthony Of Padua as well as being an assistant there. After two and a half years, I was moved to St. John's Cathedral in residence teaching liturgy throughout the diocese to the laity in different parishes.

I plan to retire in two years when I will have been a priest for 50 years.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.




December Program Christmas Breakfast

Babette's Feast and Other Anecdotes of Destiny

Babette's Feast" is best recognized as a classic film circa 1979. In print, the Catholicity of the story really shines far brighter than in the film.

The collection of stories, entitled "Anecdotes of Destiny" deal with the paradox of the reality where both free will and God's will exist.

Each of the five stories in the collection are masterfully written and "Babette's Feast" is the crown jewel of the lot.

A pious Lutheran cult-like community slowly unravels after its elderly "Dean" passes away. His two daughters, now spinsters, do their best to keep their father's humble community - a small fishing village in Norway - viable.

On a cold rainy night, a French woman near death knocks on the sisters' door with a letter of introduction from a famous opera singer, who had passed through the village on a holiday, and was enchanted by the voice of one of the sisters and begged the Dean to permit him to give her voice lessons.

The employment was short lived, but the opera singer never forgot the sister's voice and the family's hospitality, so provided a letter to the French woman, Babette, who has lost everything in a revolution in Paris.

The daughters keep Babette on as a housekeeper for many years until Babette wins a large sum of money from the lottery. This windfall occurred near the anniversary of the Dean's 100th birthday and the sisters planned a modest memorial until Babette begged them to allow her to cook a meal for the brotherhood.

One of the guests was to be the nephew of an elderly matron. The nephew had been a young officer and quite smitten with one of the sisters, however he pursued his military career, stationed in Paris during the rebellion where Babette's family were killed, and her famed restaurant destroyed.

Babette cooks a sumptuous feast for the cult members whose diet for decades was, by choice, limited to a penitential bread soup and boiled fish.

But enough about the food. The story is about the complex relationships of the sisters, the members of the brotherhood, the General, and of course, Babette. It is a story of forgiveness, redemption, and destiny.
