One of the biggest issues in the current news cycle is the wholesale adoption of Critical Race Theory and Gender Identity in primary grades K-6.


The grave harm done to children subjected to these curricula has

November Speaker Recap Joe Heschmeyer

"The Catholic Church is the original nondenominational church, and if we

are correct about the papacy, everyone should be Catholic, stated December breakfast speaker, Joe Heschmeyer, from Kansas City.

Catholics struggle with evangelism because they believe they don't know enough, but we will never have all the answers or be able to cover all topics in our attempts to convince others of the truth of the Church. Joe advises focusing on and being ready to defend the papacy. The reality and structure of Jesus and his apostles look a lot like the papacy, Joe says. The biblical fishing/net story indicates a model of leadership when the apostles state they will go with Jesus. Peter was elevated beyond just his role as an apostle.

Discussing John 21 and Luke 22 may be the simplest and least complicated passages when discussing with others, Joe believes. John 21 is an epilogue of what is to come next. Going out and making disciples is a mission to the end of time, a journey toward eternity. The church has a top-down authority, but its leaders must be servants, reminds St. Luke.

An apologist and blogger for Catholic Answers, Joe's books include "Pope Peter" and "The Early Church was Catholic" which focuses on words and actions of those who lived right after the apostles in the first two centuries. Joe holds degrees in law, philosophy, and sacred theology.

"What it looks like to live out what the apostles taught is simply the Catholic Church," Joe concludes.
