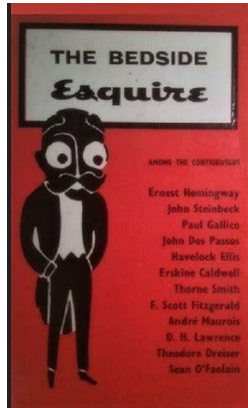
The Bedside Esquire

703 pages, hardbound



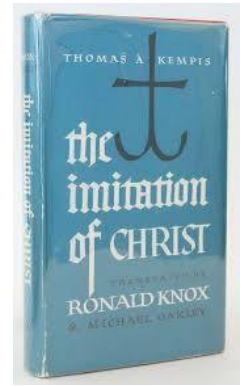
Before “Esquire Magazine: became a magazine not suitable to serious Christians, it was under the editorship of Arnold Gingrich, who collected the best contemporary authors of his day – Hemingway, Steinbeck, Lardner, Gallico, Dos Passos, Hughes, Caldwell, Dreiser, etc. – and introduced the public to fiction, essays, travel, sports, and humor of a quality unseen before or since. The Bedside Esquire is a collection of these stories and essays, from a time modern readers might consider simpler, but certainly no less dangerous than today. (It was the start of WW2 after all!) I found this a very comfortable book to read, each story convenient to be relished in a single sitting. Look for your copy in a used bookstore or thrift shop. Mine cost .35 cents.

The first two parts of this series of quotations from “The Imitation of Christ” were in our October and November newsletters. This article continues with some brief passages.



Chapter 15: On Charity as the motive of our actions: The performance of an action is worthless in itself if it is not done out of charity. Charity must be our motive. After all, what God takes into account is not so much the thing we do, as the love that went into doing it. Act for the public good, not for your own pleasure.

Chapter 16: On putting up with other people’s “faults.” There will always be faults in others and ourselves. There is nothing to do but to put up with it – perhaps the best way to test your patience. You would do well to pray about such inconveniences – ask God in his mercy to help you bear them calmly. There is no better test of a man’s quality than when he cannot have things his way.

Chapter 18: On the example set for us by our Holy Fathers: Apostles and martyrs, confessors and virgins, and all those who would follow in Christ’s footsteps, many were the trials they went through, caring nothing for life in this world, if life might be theirs in eternity. Strangers to the world? Yes, but close and intimate friends of God. Never let it be said that you fell asleep over your task of growth in holiness, you who have had all these examples of devotion constantly before your eyes.

Speaker Recap: Joelle Maryn

“Teresa of Avila once said, “More tears are shed over answered than unanswered prayers.”

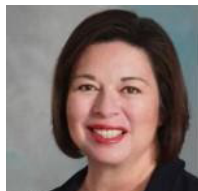
November breakfast speaker Joelle Maryn appeared outwardly to have the whole package of worldly success: beauty, a modeling and acting career, a billboard in Times Square, an ABC network show, and a high-end cosmetic company which enabled an elegant lifestyle. Still, her life felt spiritually empty, joyless, and without purpose. She did not recognize the face looking back from the mirror. As a six-year-old, she had experienced the trauma of losing an 11-year-old sister in a house fire, and her childhood was one with an alcoholic father and a mother in and out of mental institutions. She found she hid behind characters and let others define her identity.

In 2015 Joelle left her business and called out, “Lord, I need you!” A grace rushed in, and she saw things in full light. Though she did not know scripture at the time, she discovered a newfound power helping others discover purpose in building up the body of Christ and evangelizing using faith-based media connections.

Joelle urges prayer for those who have hurt us, for all are wounded or struggling in some way. Be healers in community, conquer evil with good, and love mercy. We make our God too small, she says. It’s all about the resurrection, for He is the God of multiplication. Ask God to open doors that need opening and to close those that need closing. Go hungry to the sacrament, and know it is never too late to influence a life. Become a miracle to someone else, she urges.

A movie outlining her life and philosophy will be released in about a year.

Business Person of the Month: Ivonne Der Torosian



Ivonne Der Torosian, Vice President for Community Health and Well-being for Saint Agnes Medical Center is the liaison between the medical center and the community.

In her role at Saint Agnes, she oversees the Health Hub, where Community Health Workers connect patients and families to vital resources, chronic disease programs to ensure people live healthier lives, and conducts community health needs assessments to understand the needs of the community.

Ivonne is also responsible for the operations of the Holy Cross Center for Health and Wellness – formerly known as the Holy Cross Center for Women. The

center currently provides substance use disorder and behavioral health programs for community members who are experiencing homelessness, and/or are low income and struggle to find resources. The center will also offer resiliency and family support programs soon.

The center continues to provide and accept donations of clothing, toiletries, diapers, and baby items (baby food, diapers, formula) for women experiencing homelessness, crisis or are low income. Holy Cross is the CP&BC Charity for this Christmas. If you wish to donate cash or check, please make your donation to Holy Cross.
