Rev. Dr. Gregory Zubacz, J.D., Ph.D.



Our February 14th breakfast speaker is Rev. Dr. Gregory Zubacz, J.D., Ph.D., Associate Provost of Fresno Pacific University and Professor of Business Law. He served previously as Director for Center of Peacemaking and Conflict Studies, and as the program director of the Criminology Department. He has taught in the areas of Criminology, Criminal Justice Administration, Restorative Justice, Evidence, Criminal Law, Corrections, Church Conflict, and Mediation and Conflict Management. He has published two books, and is currently writing a chapter for an international law book regarding recent legal developments on the seal of confession in the United States.

Fr. Greg, a priest of the Ukrainian Greco-Catholic Church, serves as pastor of the Apostolate of the Archangel Michael in Clovis, located at Our Lady of Perpetual Help School Chapel. The Apostolate is a part of the St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of Chicago, under the jurisdiction of His Excellency Bishop Benedict. Prior to going to seminary, he was an attorney both in private practice and government, and he is a member of two provincial bars. Fr. Greg received Holy Orders through the laying on of hands by Metropolitan Michael Bzdel + December 18, 2004. Before coming to Fresno, Fr. Greg served in the Archeparchy of Winnipeg for ten years, including three as Chancellor and five as prison chaplain. He received his Ph.D. and J.C.D. at Saint Paul University / University of Ottawa in 2008.

The Ukrainian Greco-Catholic Church is the largest Eastern Catholic denomination of the 24 churches that make up the Universal Church, and one of 14 which follow the Byzantine Rite in worship and spirituality. The UGCC includes about seven million members worldwide and is in full communion with the Bishop of Rome, Pope Francis.

Fr. Greg's wife, Melita, teaches music and is director of the wonderful OLPH school choir we enjoyed at our Christmas Party. They have three daughters.

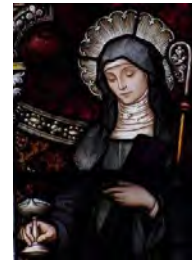


December Annual Christmas Party

Book Review

Andrew Jackson and the Miracle of New Orleans by Brian Kilmeade and Don Yaeger | Sentinel, an imprint of Penguin Random House, New York, 2017 | 279 pages, paper bound.

Everybody has studied Andrew Jackson in school and remembers him for fighting duels and The Battle of New Orleans which was during the War of 1812. But the Common Core doesn't give Jackson justice. Today he's relegated to being a poster boy for toxic masculinity.

Shame on Common Core. Jackson, while certainly no snowflake, was a complex character dealing with insurmountable odds fighting the British Army, the premier fighting force of the times, in a Southern theater where patriotism was untried while the New Englanders in the East were leaning towards surrender.

A militia general with no formal military training, Jackson was tasked with first defeating a warring tribe of Creeks known as the Red Sticks which had allied with the British in the swampy South. Meanwhile, in the East the Old Revolutionary War Generals were recalled to service, and it soon became obvious by a series of humiliating defeats, they weren't the golden boys of their revolutionary days nearly 39 years prior. With few regular troops the old generals were unable to muster a competent fighting force from the reservists they commanded. The British took the capitol city of Washington DC and burned it to the ground.

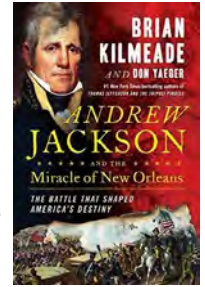
Andrew Jackson was different.

Left an orphan during the Revolution by murderous British soldiers (who were nothing like the jolly chaps portrayed on Masterpiece Theater) Jackson had a personal score to settle and aimed to do just that in New Orleans. Common Core would not approve, for Jackson had the charisma to marshal a variety of troops comprised of French and Spaniards, freed slaves and merchants, Cajun river men and militiamen, regulars, reservists, Kentucky Volunteers, and sailors along with the spiritual help of Ursuline sisters.

But that part of the story is pretty much common knowledge if you've seen the Charlton Heston movie.

What I enjoyed about this book is that it details exactly how the battles were fought—how Jackson gathered intelligence about the British Naval and troop movements as well as the heroism of the men under his command. The diplomatic intrigues of the negotiations at Ghent adds historical insight.

If you've the hankering for a history lesson, this should tickle your fancy.
