June 12 — Rebecca Kiessling

Profiled by Tom Lang

Our Friday, June 12th speaker, Rebecca Kiessling, will be connecting to our Zoom meeting from her home in Detroit, Michigan. Rebecca has been a pro-life speaker since 1995 and has shared her powerful testimony throughout the world.

Having been conceived in rape, nearly aborted, then placed for adoption, Rebecca became an attorney, and has dedicated her life to defending others who are also at risk of being aborted.



Raised in a Jewish home, Rebecca first came to know Christ while in high school, fell away, then was called back while in law school, completing the RCIA. She was baptized, received her first Holy Communion and Confirmation at Easter Vigil in 1994.

Heritage House '76 published Rebecca's story in their popular pamphlet "Conceived in Rape: A Story of Hope." She has appeared on EWTN and has been interviewed on Relevant Radio numerous times. She appeared in "The 40 Film," the Citizens United film "The Gift of Life with Governor Mike Huckabee," and several other pro-life documentaries.

Rebecca changed the heart of Governor Rick Perry and Newt Gingrich during their presidential campaigns and has been politically influential both nationally and internationally.

Her speaking experience includes Pregnancy Resource Center fundraisers, Right to Life events, Respect Life events, Catholic high schools, universities, attorney conferences, and women's events. Rebecca is also the president and founder of Save The 1 — a global pro-life network of nearly 1000 mothers who became pregnant by rape and other women who have faced challenging pre-natal diagnoses.



Book Review

How Catholic Art Saved the Faith: The Triumph of Beauty and Truth in Counter Reformation Art | By Elizabeth Lev | Sophia Institute Press, 2018 | 310 pages, paperback



On rare occasions I like to read something on poetry or art in order to astound people at cocktail parties.

One of my favorite Art Historians is Elizabeth Lev whose expertise is on Church History as told by its Art. This book has its origins in a project brought about by the 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. Some of the changes brought about by Luther were a disdain for religious art as well as the Eucharist, Confession, Penance, Angels, Saints, Holy Orders, the Blessed Virgin, Purgatory, and...well the list goes on.

Luther's disdain for religious art, Lev tells us, is partially to blame on the artists and sculptors of the time (1517-ish) when some Catholic artists had started indulging in "Art for Art's Sake" with lascivious provocations and vanity, losing sight of the religious stories which, up until then, was how the Faith was illustrated in her churches. Of course Luther would have none of it, and much church art was destroyed as a result. The Council of Trent, in 1545-1563 reaffirmed the role of art in the Church and a crew of talented, but rather (rather what? Troubled? Frisky? Drunk?) artists were provided with patronage to kick start the Catholic artistic tradition in response to the heretical reformers.

And that is where this story begins. And I've used up most of my allotted space for this review already!

"How Catholic Art Saved the Faith" is a great book. You will learn a tremendous amount of Church History without really trying. Elizabeth Lev's stories are both hilarious and thought provoking and illustrated with incredible art with the esoteric details richly described, both from the artistic and historic perspectives. You will get to know each artist like he (or she) was your best Bud.

And., you will astound people at the next cocktail party you go to.

If you have a pilgrimage to Rome in your future or an online tour now during the time of Covid-19, this should be required reading.

Luke Spehar joined us via Zoom from Saint Paul, Minnesota; his last visit five years ago was while he and his wife were on a seven-month van tour. Now in the time of Covid-19, he and his wife have three children in their busy, noisy home.



Luke thanked us for creating a space for a musician during the pandemic lockdown and reflected on how different this Easter Season is. His first song was about hope, and was written after a trip to Medjugorge. One night he climbed to the top of Cross Mountain to experience the sunset and sunrise; the sunrise was a sign of Hope—something we all need right now. He played the song “The Sunrise.” The refrain “stay alive just to see the sun,” reminded us about hope.

The unknown has made this time so challenging, and Luke reflected on the pull of the Evil One. His song “To Saint Michael” is a devil “stompin” tune to call on the armies of angels and slay the Dark One.

Luke suggested that scripture is a place to find God. He reflected on the anxiety Joseph had when he was trying to find a place for Mary to stay, on the night Jesus was born.
