

October 11—Chris Bray

Our October 11th breakfast will feature full-time Catholic speaker and musician Chris Bray, who is coming to us all the way from London, Ontario.

JOY—this is the resounding message of Chris Bray's brand-new release. "Joy in my Heart," the full-length album from the multiple Gospel Music Association Covenant award winning artist, brings a fresh, yet familiar perspective, offering hope and inspiration to the



world. Chris's music hits home with relevant themes, recounting real life stories and circumstances, craftily leading people on a journey of excitement, inspiration, joy, and even to tears.

Chris's new album has impacted Christian radio across Canada, with the first single (and music video), "King in His Kingdom," hitting #27 on the Canadian Christian radio chart, and #4 on the More Radio CANCON chart, maintaining the top five status for three consecutive months. It also topped the iTunes Inspirational chart reaching the top 25, during release week.

"With this new record, I felt like God had placed real life stories and circumstances on my heart that others could relate to and be inspired by," says Chris.

Chris's refined songwriting extends from a catalog of mostly praise and worship. While this project contains some of that as well, his skills as a songwriter and communicator illuminate the gifts God has bestowed on him.

Demand for his concerts and speaking presentations is high, and Chris's busy travel schedule leads him across Canada and the United States, speaking to tens of thousands each year. His largest audience included the March for Life on Parliament Hill, where he headlined for over 25,000 in attendance, as well as an Air Canada Centre Gospel concert following a Raptors game in Toronto.

This hasn't worked out well.


Guzman reminds us that a Catholic

September Speaker Recap— Dan DeMatte

Animated and entertaining, Dan DeMatte returned to Fresno six years after his first speaking engagement with CP&BC.

His presentation focused on his experiences as a youth minister at a successful camp where teens are re-awakened to their Catholic faith through *Encounter*, *Culture*, *and Deployment* taking the point rather than by book learning.



This struck a cord with me as I've subbed at a Catholic elementary school, and the curriculum's books on religion were nothing short of torture. Dan thinks teens need an *Encounter* with Jesus first and later supported by intellectual activity.

The illustrative example he gave was an *Encounter* with Krispy Kreme doughnuts—the essence is the doughnut, not the company history or the proper way to reheat cold doughnuts.

Get to know and love your Krispy Kremes first, and the rest will follow.

This is the way, Dan offers, of re-awakening the faithful, not only teens but the Catholic Church as a whole, from the secularism that has more than decimated recruitment in the company of future Saints.

Perhaps a good penance might be "Say the Act of Contrition, and eat two Krispy Kremes." (If any clergy happen to be reading this!)

Following *Encounter* comes *Culture*, the Judeo-Christian culture that built Western Civilization—long before a certain US president declared that "we" have progressed to being a post-Christian nation—needs to be reestablished as well as developing a vibrant, uniquely Catholic culture.

As an aside, a fellow I knew of who owned a cafe claimed he could identify the Jews and the Catholics by what kind of food they ordered. Could anyone say the same today?

The third revelation in Dan's formula is *Deployment*—actively living the Catholic Faith, taking *action* within the secular world—I'm thinking practicing the corporeal works of mercy like in the Book of Tobit.

It was a very inspirational talk.
