

June Speaker - Father Dan Avila

Our June 13 speaker will be Father Dan Avila, Director of Vocations for the Diocese of Fresno. He assists those men who are seeking to serve as priests and also helps to develop vocations awareness, promotion programs, and activities in the diocese.

Fr. Dan will talk about his continuing discernment groups for young men who feel

they may be called by God to do something more with their lives — beyond just looking out for their own interests — by considering a priestly vocation. These groups meet on a regular basis in the major regions of the diocese — Merced, Fresno, Visalia/Tulare, and Bakersfield.

During the discernment process, everyone moves along at their own pace, responding to the movement of the Holy Spirit. Some will decide to continue in the process, hearing God's voice not from the clouds, but from within their own hearts.

The men who have decided to move toward a priestly vocation will then begin the application process, much like filling out an application for any college, but with a deeper look at the person's mental and emotional state, family background, and spiritual life — all to understand how they came to their spiritual calling.

It's an involved process with many interesting aspects, and Fr. Dan will describe the solemn as well as the humorous steps along the journey in his light-hearted and approachable way. The whole Church needs to foster vocations — Fr. Avila will let us know how we can help within our own families and parishes.

Speaker Recap By Katherine Andes





Book Review

Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist By Brant Pitre Doubleday, New York 2011 228 pages hardbound, \$21.99

Catholics see the prefiguring of the New Testament in the Old Testament, and coming to grips with the prose and imagery has kept theologians in line for centuries. Dr. Pitre

investigates The Last Supper and the Eucharist through the eyes of a first century Jew and takes his readers on an unforgettable voyage through the Bible. This isn't quite like Rabbi Misener's contribution to Pope Benedict's first volume of Jesus of Nazareth, which explained the Jewish sensibilities at the time of Christ, but rather as an exploration into the ties between the Old Testament prophecies and the graphic New Testament imagery surrounding the Eucharist.

Dr. Pitre has an engaging style of writing which is a delight to read. He takes the time to explain the meanings behind the Ancient Greek and Hebrew words and the thoughts of the Church Fathers as well as such resources as The Dead Sea Scrolls, The Works of Josephus (a 1st century Jewish Historian), The Mishnah (a collection of rabbinic oral Histories from 50 BC to 200 AD), The Targums (ancient Jewish translations of the Bible from Hebrew to Aramaic circa 587 BC), The Babylonian Talmud, and The Midrashim (ancient Jewish Biblical Commentaries). This book changed the way I thought about the Eucharist, the Passover, and the Last Supper by presenting the subject with far more vibrancy and imagery.
