Fr. Christopher Alar, MIC, lives and works on Eden Hill in Stockbridge, Massachusetts, home of the National Shrine of The Divine Mercy, where he serves as "Fr. Joseph, MIC," the director of the Association of Marian Helpers.

Before becoming a priest, Fr. Chris received his BS in industrial engineering and an MBA from the University of Michigan.

After working several years at a Fortune 500 company, he began his own consulting company in Charlotte, North Carolina in 2000. After answering the Lord's call, he attended Franciscan University in Steubenville, Ohio, for his philosophy studies and earned his Masters of Divinity from Holy Apostles Seminary in Cromwell, Connecticut.

Over the past several years he has been mentored by the world's leading experts in Divine Mercy, and he has spoken at over one hundred parishes to date.

Speaker Recap By Pauline Smoke


According to genealogical research conducted by her daughter, Mona Faulkner's family is "Catholic all the way back to God." Faulkner's father tried to teach his seven children the relationship between

the Gospel message and daily life, while her mother taught them to, "Say your prayers, and ask God for help." This foundation of faithbased values has supported the Fresno Diocese's Superintendent of Catholic Schools through many difficult situations.

Faulkner believes that teaching children about faith is central to Catholic education, because faith helps students develop a "Catholic conscience" that goes beyond required community service to true concern for those around them. This - even more than a strong work ethic and rigorous academic training — is what makes Catholic school graduates so valuable to their communities. Faulkner also stresses that graduates need to "know how to lead, even if they don't want to lead."

Since Faulkner laments that the dwindling availability of religious faculty members is having a profound impact on Catholic school budgets, she is exploring ways to increase funding for the salaries of lay teachers and administrators, who often earn 15-30% less than their public school counterparts.

On the student side, Faulkner says that "we ignore the middle class at our peril." Fortunately, a "Good Angel Fund" is being established to help such families cope with first-year expenses, thus allowing them time to adjust their budgets to make Catholic education a priority. Of course, it won't hurt if they also say their prayers and ask God for help.




